- *This week in Math we reviewed and took the End of Module Assessment. Next week we will start Module 5 (fractions).
- -FYI- During the first and second quarters, I would tell the children which numbers/problems needed a sentence on their weekly quizzes. Starting this quarter I am telling them how many sentences total they should have on the quiz. For the fourth quarter, I will not tell them anything. My hint all year has been if a problem has words they need to answer with words.

We focused on nonfiction. We have been writing several essays about something important to us. These had to be real people, places, or things.
