\*This week in Math the students took their End of Module 5 on Monday and learned how to make equivalent decimals and fractions for tenths and hundredths, to compare decimals, and to place decimals on a number line. After spring break we will start our Geometry Module.

\*All students will need a protractor by April 2. (Some students gave me their protractor at the beginning of the year.)

-Students should still be completing xtramath 4 times every week. (Some students have been logging on and letting it time out. This does not count as a session.)

\*We had a nice week in ELA. We finished presenting our slide shows, which were awesome. We have continued writing about our books. We spent some time reading to self. This is so fun to be a part of and to watch the students get into their reading and then rush up and tell me what they just read.

-Grammar and reading logs keep working on them.

-Captains reading program starts the week we are back from spring break. As long as you are reading 5 days out of 7 you will be fine.

\*This week in Science we finished our Dinosaur Strides lesson. The students learned the relationship between leg length and stride length. We also did a few introduction lessons to electricity. We will start that unit after we finish our fossils unit. After spring break we will research different dinosaurs.

\*In Social Studies we have moved onto early transportation, specifically canals and railroads. We watched a few short videos about how locks work, very fascinating. We have continued our quizlet and quizlet live reviews. I added in a quizizz review, that we have been working with as well. This serves as a review for anything they are reading. It has shown students just how important it is to read carefully.
