

Hello!

\*This week in Math the students learned how to identify and draw points, lines, line segments, rays, parallel lines, and perpendicular lines, to identify acute (less than 90 degrees), right (equal to 90 degrees), obtuse (greater than 90 degrees and less than 180 degrees), and straight (180 degrees) angles, and that there are 360 degrees in a circle and a 1-degree angle is  $1/360$  of a turn. The students also started learning how to use protractors to measure angles. Next week we will continue to measure and construct angles using a protractor.

-Students should still be completing xtramath 4 times every week. (Some students have been logging on and letting it time out. This does not count as a session.)

\*We have had a good week back from break. We spent time reviewing for the AIR test next week. We will be testing Tuesday and Wednesday next week for Language Arts only. Please try and have your child get a good night sleep both Monday and Tuesday nights. Also, if they could have something to eat before school that would be great. As if they needed any more proof, students saw first-hand what a difference slowing down makes during an exercise yesterday. It was great to see how they responded.

-The Captains Reading Program has started. If your child turned in a correctly completed reading log they received their first base reward. This will continue for the next 3 weeks. The game is on Friday, May 31st.

\*This week in Science we did an activity called 'How Dinosaurs Lived'. The students used their Chromebooks to research a dinosaur. After they completed their research, each student shared their information with the class.

\*In Social Studies we have continued our development of transportation with canals and railroads.

\*The ELA AIR Tests will be April 9 and April 10.

-The Math AIR Test will be April 30 and May 1.
