What We're Learning

Reading: I am really impressed at how much the children are reading at home and how excited they are about reading!!! Please keep working on those Fry Sight words! This will really help your child out a great deal with reading. Right now we are focusing on Fry Words list 2: at, this, from, one, by, but, what, were, when, can, be, have, or, had, word, not, all, we, your, and said. We will be having a test over the first two lists of words at the end of the month. We will also be reviewing all of our accuracy strategies to help us when we get to a word we don't know. For comprehension we are starting to learn about story elements: Who are the characters? What is the setting? What are the main events in the story? In language we are really focusing on ending our sentences with a period for a statement and a question mark for a question.

Phonics/Word Study: This week for word study we are focusing on words that have the digraphs ch, sh, th, wh, ck again. This week on the Word Study test your child will have to use the words in two sentences (one as a statement ending with a period and one as a question, ending in a question mark. Please practice with simple dictations at home.)

Fundations- Again with Fundations we are learning the digraph sounds. We will also be learning how to read and write the trick words: as, has, to, into, we, he, she, be, me, for, or.

Math: We are doing a lot of subtracting in our math unit. We are also doing subtraction story problems. Please have your child work on what number is one less than a given number.

Ex. What number is one less than 10? 9! Students who are still struggling with this are able to refer to their number line!
